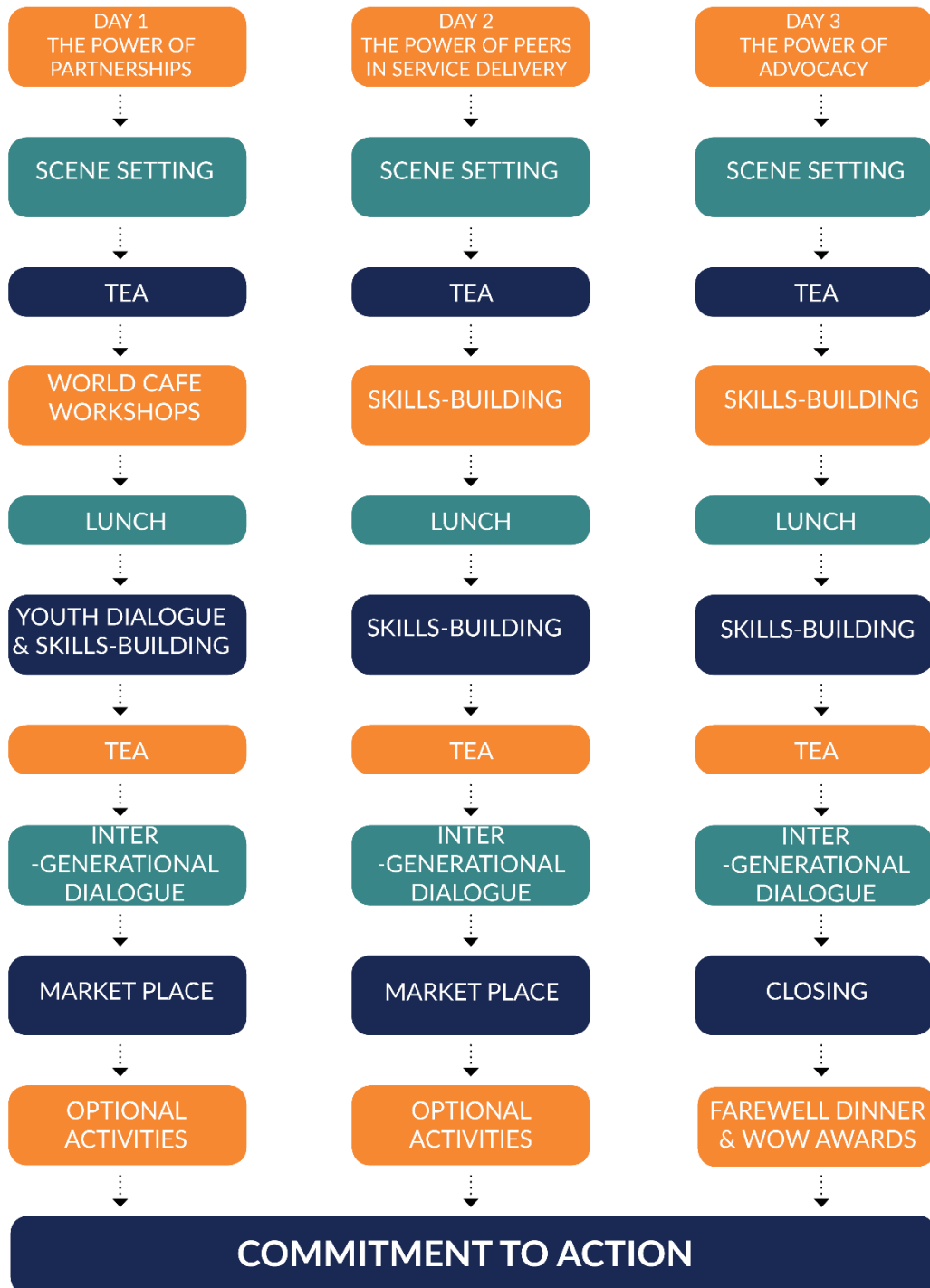

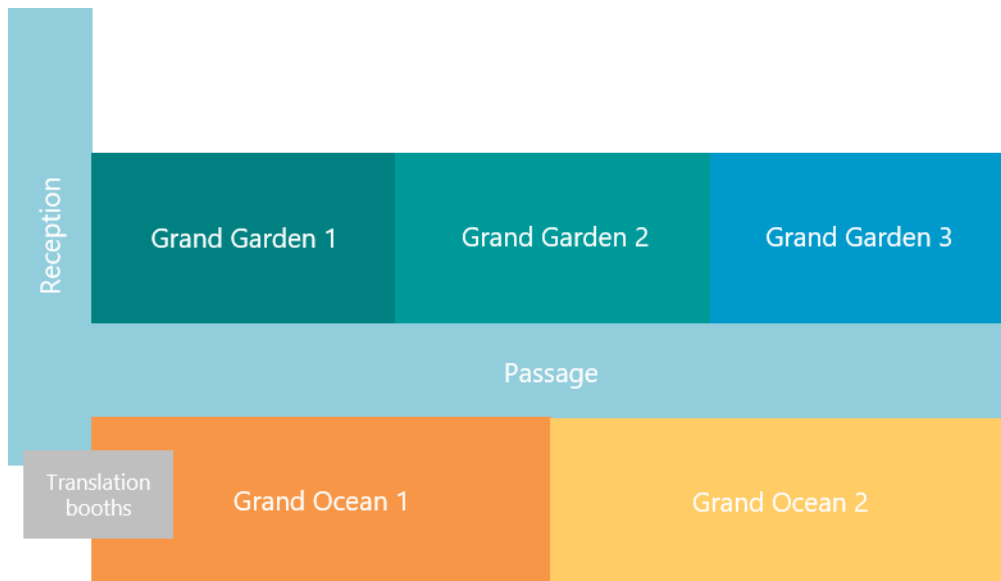

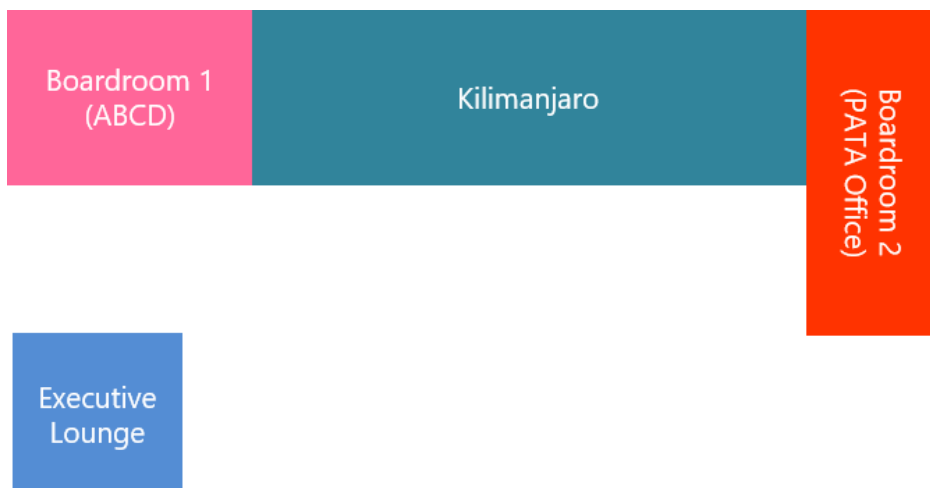
Ramada Hotel Layout

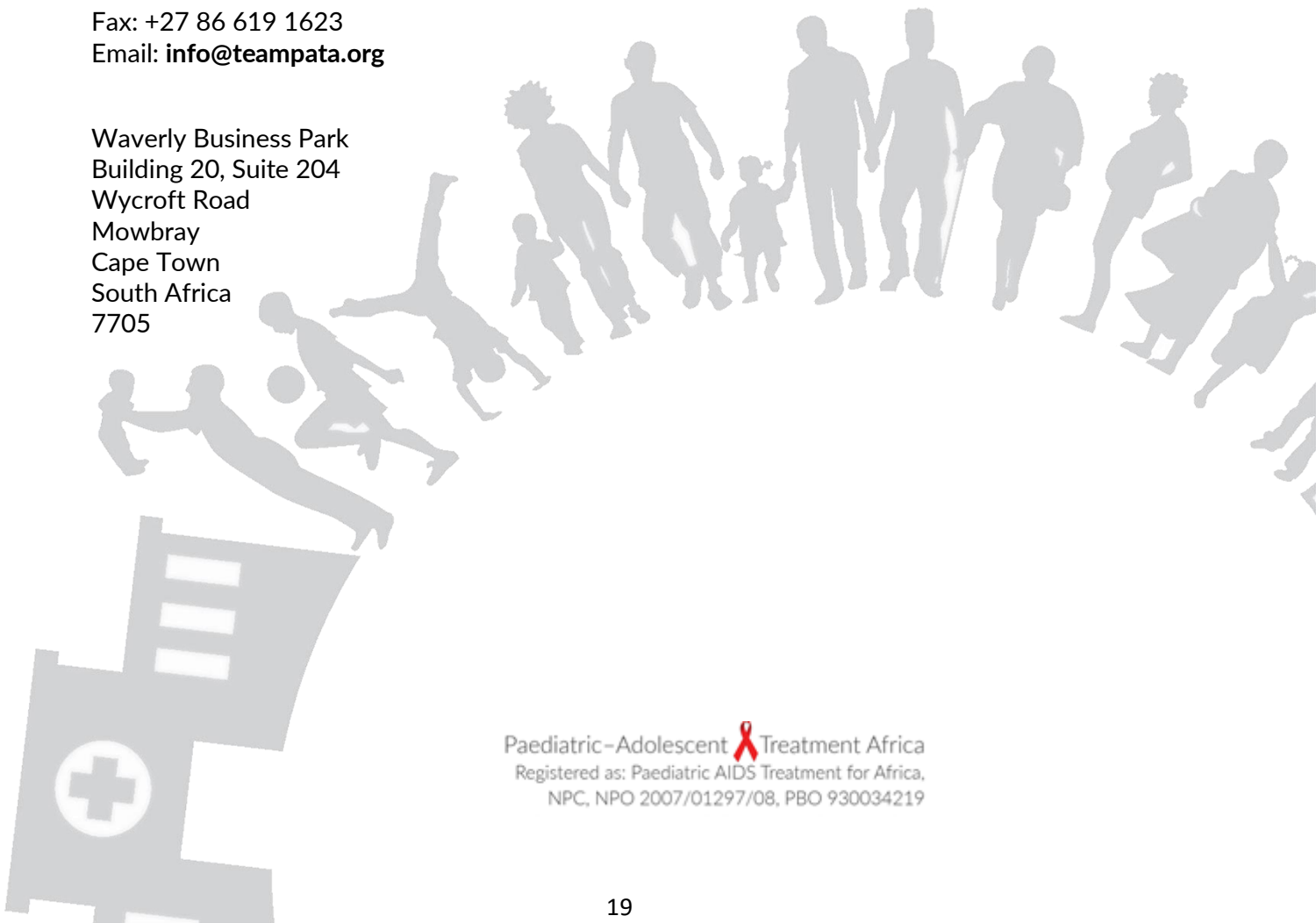
Paediatric Adolescent Treatment Africa
