This year's summit will focus on building momentum and galvanising action around global, national, and local commitments highlighted in the Global Alliance Country Plans to End AIDS by 2030. We are excited to return to an in-person format, welcoming over 150 healthcare providers, partner organisations, and government delegates. The summit will also be broadcast to more than 6000 participants through PATA's Linking and Learning Hub.



## How to Navigate the Summit Programme

Each session includes its room location and language options (French, Portuguese). Interpretation will be offered in only one session room each day (Lakeview) so please check the schedule and follow the signs to find your sessions.

- Prime Sessions begin daily at 8:30 AM in the same session room (Lakeview), and live-streamed on the PATA Linking and Learning Hub.
- Africa Cafés run simultaneously in different rooms each day. Select your preferred Café and check the room locations on the programme and at the venue. The same Africa Cafés are re-run each day, but in a different room – this ensures that each day you can access one of the four Africa Cafe sessions. Each Africa Cafe is focused on a different pillar of the Global Alliance to end AIDS in children by 2030.
- Workshops take place in the afternoons and are in-person only (no virtual option). Each room will host the same workshop, so you don't have to choose a room.
- The Marketplace will be open in-person and online on Monday, 4 November, and Tuesday, 5 November. For in-person delegates, the Marketplace will be available in the River Bar at Irene Country Lodge during tea breaks and after workshops.
- The Gala Dinner and Awards Ceremony will be held on Monday, 4 November, at 7:00 PM at the Meadow Green Restaurant. All delegates are invited to wear traditional clothing from their home countries.
- Side meetings with Ministry of Health representatives will focus on the READY programme and comprehensive programming for adolescents and young people, these are taking place Monday and Tuesday in the Lakeview Executive Board Room.

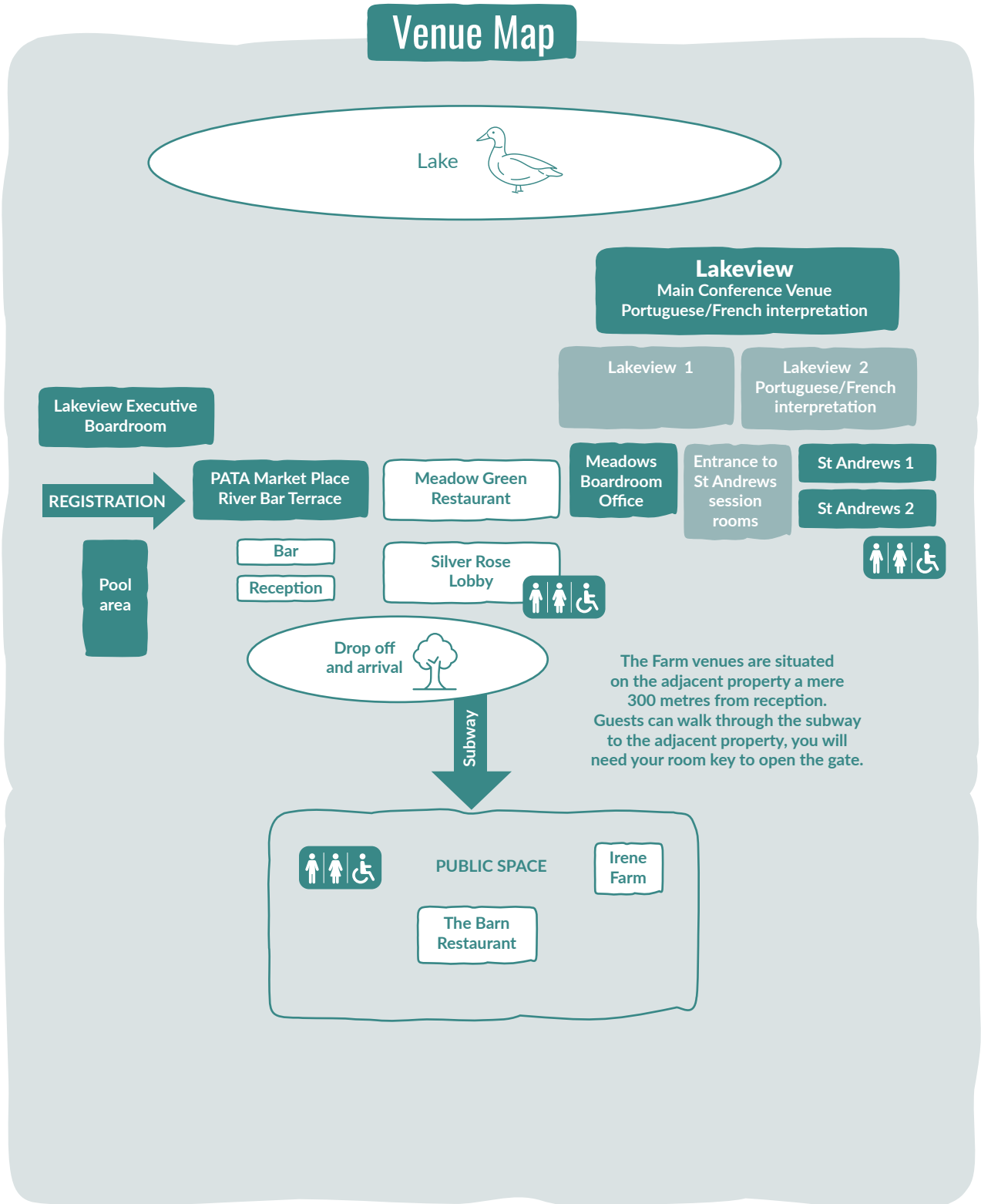
