VOICES AND ADVOCACY

Healthcare providers, together with community partners, are central to ending AIDS.

On the frontline, health providers hold the knowledge and insight into operational barriers and good practices. They deliver critical services, despite difficult working conditions and resource constraints. Too often, their contributions go unrecognised and their voices are not heard in decision-making or in the planning and review of policies and programmes they implement. This is why PATA focuses on **Reviewing** service delivery models, **Engaging** peers, **Accessing** experts, **Learning** from and sharing local experiences and innovations – keeping it **REAL!**

STRATEGIES

Our strategies are designed with healthcare providers at the center, focusing on the following areas, we aim to:

- Expand and strengthen an Africa-wide network of frontline healthcare providers and facilities in partnership with communities
- Facilitate platforms for the exchange of experiences, knowledge and best practices among frontline healthcare providers
- Provide frontline healthcare providers and facilities with locally led responsive, and cost-efficient technical assistance
- Champion innovative and targeted service delivery models
- Generate, collate, and disseminate evidence, and collaborate in joint advocacy initiatives and partnerships



THE NETWORK INCLUDES

-  4 571 FHPs in 904 health facilities
-  2 997 Ministry of Health representatives, managers and policy makers
-  528 peer supporters (community health workers)
-  741 members of community-based organisations or non-governmental organisations
-  4850 members on the PATA Linking and Learning Hub

This network of FHPs collectively contributes to supporting 307 057 children and adolescents receiving ART, with many more receiving quality prevention services, care and support from frontline healthcare facilities.

The PATA Network is always growing, these numbers represent data between 2020-2023, for updated data see the PATA website.
